ORDER RESCINDING ADVERSE WEATHER

AFTER REVIEW of the "Order Adopting Superior Court Weather Policy" dated December 1, 2005 the Court is of the opinion that the current policy as stated therein does not allow for the flexibility to cancel or delay Superior Court depending on the particular circumstances then existing and further does not allow the presiding Judge to have input in the decision process.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the Order Adopting Superior Court Weather Policy dated December 1, 2005 is hereby rescinded in its entirety. Adverse Weather decisions shall be made on a case by case basis in conjunction with other Court Officials as has been the case for several years, with final decisions for Superior Court cancellations or delays resting with the Senior Resident Superior Court Judge in consultation with the Clerk of Court for the respective County. If a trial term of Superior Court is in session the Superior Court Judge presiding in consultation with the Clerk of Court of the County may make such final decisions concerning weather related delays or cancellations as relates to the trial term in session.
