Social Security Numbers and Identifying Information (G.S. 132-1.10)

- G.S. 132-1.10 regulates the ability of the NCAOC to collect and then to make public social security numbers. It also regulates the ability of the NCAOC to make public other personal identifying information. In summary:
 - 1. When it has collected a social security number, the NCAOC must segregate the number on a separate page from the rest of the record, to facilitate redaction. Therefore, social security numbers will not be included in record produced in response to a public record(s) request.
 - 2. The NCAOC also may not disclose other "identifying information" that it may hold. Here is a list of identifying information which, as mandated by statute, shall be reducted from public records prior to production of record(s):
 - Social security numbers or taxpayer identification numbers
 - Drivers' license numbers (except on law enforcement records)
 - Passport numbers
 - Checking or savings account numbers
 - Credit card or debit card numbers
 - Biometric data
 - Fingerprints
