Re: Tenth Judicial District (Wake County) Court Operations – Beginning January 19, 2021

(Amended V.2)

The emergency directive of Former Chief Justice Cheri Beasley postponing non-essential, in-person court proceedings for 30 days, beginning December 14, 2020, is set to expire on January 13, 2021. Chief Justice Paul Newby has indicated his intention to leave operational decisions to local jurisdictions who can best determine the public health requirements. As a result, we intend to expand court operations in the 10<sup>th</sup> Judicial District (Wake County) at the start of the January 19, 2021 session<sup>1</sup> as set out in the following pages. The information contained herein is contingent upon further orders of Chief Justice Newby and Governor Cooper.

**Further modifications to this plan will be implemented as warranted.** We will continue to consult with local county and health officials regarding the impacts of COVID on our community and will publicize changes to court operations on the Wake County COVID-19 Updates page.

However, the number of staff available may be reduced due to safety precautions, approved leave, and adjusted working schedules. This aspect of the Remote Protocol is now effective on Thursday, January 21, 2021. Jury Trials in civil district court will resume as provided in the 10th Judicial District Jury Trial Resumption Plan. • Cases in which all parties stipulate to a jury of six or eight may be given a priority setting. If all parties stipulate to a reduced number of jurors, please contact the District Court TCC (Amy.L.Turner@nccourts.org). If all parties consent to waive a trial by jury, please notify the District Court TCC (Amy.L.Turner@nccourts.org) so that she may set your matter for a bench trial to avoid further delays caused by the impact of COVID-19 on the court system. Bench Trials will resume as calendared and will continue to be conducted in Courtroom 9C. All attorneys, parties and witnesses must appear in person for the trial unless specifically ordered otherwise by the Presiding Judge.
