Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the November 15, 2019 meeting were approved, as written.

Old Business

Update on Registration of Pro Se Filers and Two-Step Verification in *Odyssey*

Andrew Simpson and Emily Mehta provided a report on the registration fields in *Odyssey*, the statewide electronic-filing and case-management system being implemented by the North Carolina Administrative Office of the Courts (NCAOC). Specifically, differences between "Guide & File," the pro se platform, and "File & Serve," the attorney platform, were discussed. Mr. Simpson indicated that two-step verification is a feature of File & Serve, but not Guide & File. Mr. Simpson reported that pro se users of Guide & File will have to provide valid credit card credentials in order to file a document, unless the filing fee is waived. Ms. Mehta reported that the registration fields in *Odyssey* may not be altered.

Discussion ensued concerning the security procedures and type of identification that must be submitted to electronically file pro se, as mandated in North Carolina Session Law 2019-243.

Mark Anderson, General Rules of Practice subcommittee chair, and Judge Christine Walczyk suggested that the rules should simply state that pro se filers must submit an acceptable form of identification and not get into specifics concerning the type of identification that is required. John Rabiej stated that the rules could achieve this result by indicating no more than "you have to use the court's electronic-filing system."

<u>Update on Unsworn Declarations Under Penalty of Perjury</u>

The topic of unsworn declarations under penalty of perjury was tabled until the next meeting.

Rules of Civil Procedure Subcommittee Report

Ann Anderson, subcommittee member, provided the Commission with the attached Rules of Civil Procedure comparison chart. Professor Anderson indicated that the language of Rule 3 needs to clearly indicate that a civil action commences at the time the complaint is electronically filed.

It is not yet known whether a summons can be issued automatically when a complaint is filed using *Odyssey*.

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Grant Buckner will determine the process for sharing proposed rule changes with the Supreme Court.

General Rules of Practice Subcommittee Report

Mark Anderson walked the Commission through a preliminary draft of a revised Rule 5, "Form of Pleadings." (This draft was not available to the Commission members at the meeting, but is now attached, with slight modification.)

Andrew Tripp proposed that the deadline for filing on a given day be 11:59 p.m., not 5:00 p.m. An 11:59 p.m. deadline coincides with the federal e-filing rules.

Discussion ensued as to whether a rule should be considered that would allow some attorneys to opt out of e-filing. It was noted that other e-filing jurisdictions do not have an "opt-out" provision.

New Business

Revisions to Supplemental Rules of Practice and Procedure for the North Carolina e-Filing Pilot Project

The Second Supplemental Rules of Practice and Procedure for the North Carolina e-Filing Pilot Project were last amended by the Supreme Court on August 27, 2013 (see 366 N.C. 618–28). The content of these rules will need to be considered for incorporation into the General Rules of Practice as the Commission proceeds.

Discussion of Plan for Report to Joint Legislative Oversight Committee

Session Law 2019-243 requires the NCAOC to report the rules promulgated under N.C.G.S. § 7A-49.5(b1) to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety by March 1, 2020. The Commission reached a consensus that as much progress as possible should be made toward the promulgation of new rules before the deadline. If rules are not promulgated by the Supreme Court before the deadline, the Commission agreed that the report should outline the progress that has been made toward that end. Andrew Simpson proposed, and Andrew Tripp concurred, that the Commission and the NCAOC keep an open line of communication with the legislature on this issue.
