Table 15: We display the number of samples gathered for the few additional ensembles we have gathered in order to test for the effects on the ensemble when preserving incumbency. We also present the unique number of plans, the unique number of plans that preserve incumbents, and the number of plans that preserve incumbents. As discussed in Section E.25, many of these ensembles strictly preserve incumbents, which is why the numbers often match.
