


## **Community Outreach**

- 3 Multi-Disciplinary Team Meetings




#### Victim-Survivors Served

#### Successes

- 8 victims identified
- Safety monitoring
- 7 (78%) were runaways and successfully located
- Community partner engagement
- Exploring more appropriate placement options
- Wrap-around services



#### **Lessons Learned**

- Community Education is Essential
  - Human trafficking is largely misunderstood
  - Victim / Survivors are often seen as criminals
- Power and Control
  - Victim / Survivors often do not self-identify
  - Distrustful of people and services
- Service Barriers
  - Victims who are almost 18
  - Those who do not identify as victims
