Mecklenburg County Project NO REST

- Hosted by Pat's Place Child Advocacy Center
- Objectives
 - Coordinate the response to human trafficking
 - Provide education to community members and professionals
 - Develop a data collection method to identify the scope of human trafficking
 - Implement screening for sexual exploitation to youth serving agencies
 - Utilize the PNR screening tool
- Future: Efforts will continue with GCC funding

Data and Trends

Data Collection

- All participating agencies submit data for suspected and confirmed victims to Coordinator on a quarterly basis using a unique identifier formula
- A unique identifier allows data entry and sharing while still maintaining the confidentiality of clients. It also eliminates duplicative entries, ensuring data validity
- Currently looking for additional ways to protect information








Gender by Age


Screening for Sexual Exploitation

Commercial Sexual Exploitation Identification Tool (CSE-IT)

- Created by WestCoast Children's Clinic
- Validated screening tool for commercial sexual exploitation for youth ages 10-18
- A score of 9-23 on the CSE-IT indicates that there is "clear concern" that a child is being commercially sexually exploited
- Utilized by select youth serving agencies in Mecklenburg County
- WestCoast sends raw data for all screenings to Coordinator monthly




Total Screenings by Age

Mean Age = 14.9 years




Clear Concern by Age


Mean Age = 15.5 years

Interdiction for the Protection of Children

- Texas Department of Public Safety and US Marshals
- More effectively identify victims of child exploitation and trafficking during a traffic stop, including missing children, human trafficking, sex offender compliance, and technology facilitated crimes against children
- Prior to program 0 reports of missing or exploited child recoveries from multiple states
- Since the training began more than 300 missing or exploited children recovered
- Advantages: no software, no personnel, immediate use

Toolkit: Child Sex Trafficking: A Training Series for Frontline Officers

- Training series to educate frontline officers on how to recognize and respond to victims of child sex trafficking.
