2023 Refreshers

Senate Bill 626 expanded rights to permanent no contact orders for victims of human trafficking; prohibits the denial of reduction of victim's compensation due to conduct that occurred when the individual was being trafficked; expands the definition of human trafficking to include "patronizes, solicits" to match the federal definition.
