Section 16.20 Grants for Nonprofit Organizations Providing Services to Victims of Human Trafficking

Federal Funding (Pandemic Relief)

- I agency's period of performance expired 12/31/2024 and is currently in the closeout process. 1 agency closed in the fall. (15 remain open)
- Addition of Kelsey Weagel as Grants Manager on 01/15/2025.
- □16.20A shows that most agencies have received 95% of their allocated funds, with five agencies already having received 100%.
- □16.20B has also disbursed 80% of its funds, which aligns with expectations given the twoyear performance period.



SECTION 16.21 Competitive Human Trafficking Funds (to Direct Service Agencies)

Federal Funding (Pandemic Relief)

With the departure of Hampton White, Ashawntee Cabello will move from Data Manager to Grants Manager to assume 16.21 grants.

NC Stop Human Trafficking, Inc. contacted the Commission to withdraw from the grant and return any funds that were disbursed to the agency. The Commission has been approved to terminate the contract.

Federal Funding (Pandemic Relief)

□ total of \$6,489,824.85 in funding. These funds were awarded to 75 agencies. The distribution from Section 16.23(1) shows that most agencies have received 90% of their allocated funds, with twenty agencies already having received 100%.

□total of \$6,133,191.96 in funding. These funds were awarded to a total of 67 agencies, there were 59 agencies awarded \$71,930.00 and 8 agencies awarded \$236,250.00. The distribution from Section 16.23(2) shows that most agencies have received 90% of their allocated funds, with twenty agencies already having received 100%.

RECURRING \$500,000 in Direct Service Grants

Request for Proposal FY 2025-2026 will be out mid to late March, with a target of March 14th.

- This will be due on April 25, 2025 by midnight.
- We are requesting to be allowed to make these 2-year grants. This would mean the award is for \$50,000 per year for twoyears.



RECURRING \$500,000 in Direct Service Grants

Suggestions for process in next round:

- 1. Scoring Matrix adjusted to reviewer feedback.
- 2. Committee reviewing these or designating someone to review on their behalf.
- 3. Concern for the volume of applications for each person to review.
 - 48-hour rule on submitted applications (vote)
 - Cap on how many items can be requested for revision
 - Break reviewers into groups or target having 5 reviewers for each application
