#### GRANT ADMINISTRATION TIMELINE

- November 18, 2021 Budget becomes law and staff work on implementation begins.
- November 29, 2021 Meeting with NCCWYI to discuss partnership and efforts.
- January 24, 2022 First meeting of the Commission's Appropriations Committee. (11 to date)
- March 3, 2022 Federal grant funds reclassified as "revenue replacement" by OSBM.
- March 22, 2022 Pangram set up complete.
- April 22, 2022 Memorandum of Understanding signed with OSBM/NCPRO for federal funds.
- June 1 30, 2022 RFP process for state-funded grants opened for 30 days and closed.
- August 10, 2022 Second round RFP issued for state-funded grants.
- August 15, 2022 U.S. Treasury updates Compliance and Reporting Guidance for federal funds.
- August 23, 2022 Two grant manager positions started their positions.
- **September 7, 2022** State facility grant agreements distributed, begin signing.
- **September 15, 2022** Presented to the General Assembly JPS Oversight Committee.

**Goal:** Complete state and federal grant RFPs and administer majority of funding in 2022.

  - \$236,250
