# INTERDICTION FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

# The Concern

- 466,949 total estimated missing child reports
- 1 in 4 girls will be sexually victimized before adulthood<sup>2</sup>
- 1 in 6 boys will be sexually victimized before adulthood<sup>2</sup>

# A Threat

There are an estimated **904,011** Registered Sex Offenders in the United States.

An estimated **53,000** of those are non-compliant.

# How many are searching?

- September 2008 , state and local law enforcement agencies across the nation employed more than 1.1 million persons on a full-time basis, including approximately 765,000 commissioned personnel.

# INTERDICTION FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN COURSE PURPOSE:

IPC is designed to make patrol officers aware of the variety of resources available to assist them in establishing the status of a child who may be missing, exploited, or at risk of exploitation and what courses of action are immediately available.

- Know resources available to them and courses of action to take when encountering an endangered child.
- Be able to identify research supported indicators of an endangered child and a high risk threat to children.
- Have a basic understanding of behavioral patterns of both suspects and victims.
- Know how to articulate their findings that are supported through research.
- Requesting agencies can receive the 2-day basic course or request a 5 day Train-the-Trainer course.

# Since the Training Began

- As a result of the Interdiction for the Protection of Children training, there have been:

Criminal arrests for offenses such as possession of child pornography, human trafficking and sexual assault of a child
