Jasmine S. McGhee serves as Special Deputy Attorney General and Director of the Public Protection Section at the North Carolina Department of Justice, where she focuses on policy and legal outreach for the people of North Carolina.

The Public Protection Section is the forward-facing unit of the North Carolina Attorney General's Office with a broad public safety mandate, including a policy, litigation, and communications focus on domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, consumer protection, and criminal justice reform (including substance use and reentry). Ms. McGhee is the Attorney General's representative on the NC Human Trafficking Commission and supervises the office's participation on the NC Domestic Violence Commission, the Financial Literacy Council, and the Victim's Compensation Fund.
