Judge Amanda L. (Amy) Wilson

Chief District Court Judge, District 16A

Judge Amanda L. (Amy) Wilson is a native of Richmond County, North Carolina.

Judge Wilson is a graduate of Wingate University. After graduating from Wingate, she taught sixth grade before attending law school. Judge Wilson graduated from North Carolina Central University School of Law in 1999 and came back to her hometown of Rockingham to practice law where she was in a general practice focusing on family law. In addition, she was the Guardian ad Litem Attorney Advocate for abused and neglected children in court. She was elected District Court Judge in 2008 in Judicial District 20A which included Anson, Richmond, and Stanly Counties. In 2018, Judge Wilson was appointed Chief District Court Judge for the newly realigned Judicial District 16A which includes Richmond, Anson, and Scotland Counties. She has served in that capacity since that time. She is an appointed member of the Chief Justice's Family Court Advisory Commission for the State. The highlight of Judge Wilson's professional career is to serve the citizens of North Carolina, and particularly her district, in the administration of justice.
