- People who are vulnerable
- People who exploit vulnerabilities to arrange and profit from the trafficking
- People who are customers

# People Who Are Customers

- Sex buying is still happening and because trafficked people in prostitution have less bargaining power than ever, it is likely to put them in ever more dangerous positions.
- Remote, web-based sexual services and pornography may also be trafficking – which means trafficking hasn't necessarily slowed down just because in-person commercial sex may be happening less frequently.

Polaris: "Sex Trafficking Is Still Happening – and May Be More Violent Than Ever"
