
## **NEW VOTER WELCOME LETTERS**

- 1. Thank the new voter for registering
- 2. Inform the new voter who their representative or senator is.
- 3. Information on how to contact the representative or senator.
- 4. Encourage the new voter to make contact if the representative or senator can be of assistance.

Additional information that is included could cause the letter to be viewed as outside the boundaries of what the LEC has commented on and may be considered unethical.
