Agustín Servin de la Mora is the president of the DE LA MORA Institute of Interpretation. He was born and raised in Mexico City, Mexico, and has been a professional freelance and staff interpreter for the last 28 years. He is a state and federally certified court interpreter, as well as a certified medical interpreter. He is one of the Supervisor Raters for the National Center for State Courts (NCSC) and has been a lead rater for the federal and NCSC's oral proficiency exams for court interpreters. He served as a member of the Florida Court Interpreter Certification Board, as a voting member on the Technical Committee of the National Consortium for Interpreter Certification, and as a member of the Project Advisory Committee, which created the National Standards for Healthcare Interpreter Training Programs for the NCIHC. He has conducted orientations and advanced skill-building workshops for court interpreters in at least 15 states and has been a consultant for the NC Administrative Office of the Courts (NCAOC). He has been featured as a speaker and presenter in several national conventions, including those of NAJIT, ATA, IMIA, and NASCA.

Kara J. Mann is the Manager of the Office of Language Access Services (OLAS) of the NCAOC. She earned her B.A. from West Virginia University in 2008 and has worked in the language access field since 2013.
