



BECOMING A COURT INTERPRETER IN THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE COURTS

Thank you for your interest in becoming a professional court interpreter. Candidates must have a high-level language proficiency and court-specific interpreting skills to be a court interpreter. To become a certified North Carolina Court Interpreter, you must:

Step 1: Attend the NC Court Interpreter Orientation Training Session and pass the English Written Exam. This is a two-and-a-half-day commitment. The English Written Exam will be administered on the last half-day of the Orientation. You can register online for the orientation and the English Written Exam at <https://www.nccourts.gov/programs/office-of-language-access-services/do-you-want-to-be-a-court-interpreter>.

The registration fee for the training and the rating of the written screening tests is \$160. The training is language neutral, so interpreters for all languages must attend.

Step 2: Submit a completed AOC-A-207 Application to be a Registered Court Interpreter: Once a candidate attends the orientation and passes the English Written Exam, an application and background check must be completed.

Step 3: NCCICE Candidates: Candidates must attend a Skill Building Workshop approved by NCAOC to be eligible to sit for the NC Court Interpreter Certification Examination (NCCICE). There are weekend workshops and intensive online training options available. Proof of successfully completing a skill building workshop must be submitted to OLAS via email.

All other Language Candidates: Your registration application will be reviewed and approved by the Office of Language Access Services (OLAS). If an NCCICE is not available for your language of expertise, then an approved OPI (oral proficiency interview) should be completed to demonstrate your language proficiency in the language of expertise.

Step 4: N.C. Court Interpreter Certification Examination (NCCICE): Candidates will be emailed a link to the registration form and must pay a registration fee. You must score 70% or higher on each of the three sections of the NCCICE to pass. Final approval of the candidate lies with NCAOC.

Step 5: Contract with NCAOC – Spanish Candidates: Upon receiving acceptable test scores, your registration application will be approved by the Manager of OLAS and sent to the NCAOC General Services Division for a contract to be extended to you. Upon receiving a signed and initialed contract from you, your name and contact information will be placed on the online NCAOC Registry of Spoken Foreign Language Court Interpreters.
