If the Clerk's Office is closed, any filings or monies may be paid at the Randolph County Magistrate's Office, located at the Randolph County Courthouse, 176 E. Salisbury Street, Suite 103, Asheboro, NC 27203. You may contact the Magistrate at 336-328-3011

The reason for this inconvenience is the need to prevent exposure to the Clerk's staff, which could result in risk to their health and further interruptions in court and Clerk's office operations.

In an effort to allow access while the courthouse is open, the attorney's mailboxes (pick-up drawers), Judge's baskets, Sheriff's pick-up basket, Asheboro Police Department's pick-up basket and District Attorney basket will be located behind the Clerk's Office on the secured hallway, **EFFECTIVE Monday, April 20, 2020.**
