COLLATERAL CONSEQUENCES ARE SIDE EFFECTS

- Of convictions
- And of dismissed charges
 - All charges stay on the record unless they are expunged
- Beyond the numbers real lives
- Stigma & disillusionment might be the most profound collateral consequences

LEGAL RELIEF FROM COLLATERAL CONSEQUENCES

Expunctions (or expungements) – "forgetting"

Certificate of Relief – "forgiving"

• Trafficking MAR ("Motion for Appropriate Relief")

HOW EXPUNCTIONS WORK

Target Record

e.g.: prostitution conviction; non-violent felony; dismissed charge

Waiting Period 0–10 years

Misc. Requirements e.g.: GED; supporting affidavits

Multiple Convictions

Previous **Disqualifying Expunction**

TRAFFICKING-SPECIFIC EXPUNCTION

• N.C. General Statute 15A-145.6




NCGS 15A-145.6


- • •
- (b) A person who has been convicted of <u>a</u> prostitution offense may petition if...
 - (1) they have not previously been convicted of a violent felony or misdemeanor
- (c)(1) The petition shall contain an affidavit that the petitioner:
 - -has no prior conviction of a violent felony or misdemeanor; **and**
 - -has not been convicted of <u>any</u> felony or misdemeanor since the prostitution conviction



QUICK TIPS FOR MAKING SUCCESSFUL REFERRALS

- Tell intake personnel "this is a trafficking case"
 - otherwise, it will seem like there is no legal remedy
- Describe the collateral consequences
- Make sure the victim/survivor knows that we ask about financial eligibility & about the trafficking
