LESSONS & CHALLENGES



TJI 2019 Year to Date:

- 34 Eastern North Carolina human trafficking survivors have been assisted with counseling, case management, housing, basic needs assistance and addictions treatment.
- 16 additional survivors received assistance with referrals to other organizations for specific needs and or safety out of state or in other areas of North Carolina.
- 4,500 local students have been educated about HT, the warning signs of and how social media is the avenue often used
- 2,183 local community partners have been trained on human trafficking and how to identify and respond (Including law enforcement, military personnel, Albert Ellis Airport employees, social service providers and more.
- 2 local students have been identified as human trafficking victims through our presentations at local ENC high schools.
