Re: Notification of Reported COVID-19 Positive Individuals in Wake County Judicial Facilities

Four employees of the Judicial Branch reported that they recently tested positive for COVID-19. We believe that the individuals last visited the Wake County Justice Center and the Wake County Courthouse on January 14, 2022 and January 19, 2022. An employee of an agency with offices in the Judicial Facilities reported that he/she recently tested positive for COVID-19 and was last in the Wake County Justice Center on January 14, 2022. An individual who visited the Wake County Courthouse on January 18, 2022 later reported testing positive for COVID-19.

The known locations where the individuals visited have been reported to Wake County General Services to be cleaned and disinfected in accordance with Wake County Public Health Division, CDC, and EPA protocols and guidance. All persons who were in these facilities during this timeframe are strongly encouraged to self-monitor for symptoms of COVID-19. Please note that this notification contains general information so as to respect medical privacy and confidentiality.

All individuals should follow the most current <u>COVID-19 Quarantine and Isolation</u> guidance from the CDC. Additional information is available from the Wake County <u>COVID-19 Information</u> page.

If you become sick or think you may have COVID-19, call your doctor, public health department, or community health center to talk to a medical professional by phone. They can provide you with additional medical information and assist you in making plans for what to do next. If you are unable to work because you become sick or think you may have COVID-19, contact your supervisor for additional information. If you test positive for COVID-19 or come in contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19, you should be contacted by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services contact tracing staff through a text, email, or phone call.
