After a welcome from Committee Chair Webb and an overview of the agenda from Committee Reporter Smith, the Committee began brainstorming possible issues for exploration and engaged in a process of winnowing those issues down to a manageable number for further work. The winnowing process involved Committee members voting on issues, with each Committee member having 12 votes to cast in each of three ways: Explore; Don't Explore; Need More Information to Decide. Members were permitted to spread their votes across multiple topics or cluster them on one or two topics. The results of this process are shown in the table below. Issues adopted for further exploration are shaded in gray. Sub-topics are representative and may change as exploration continues.

The meeting also included a presentation from John Byrd, Director of the N.C. Crime Laboratory, focusing on lab backlog and delay. His PowerPoint presentation is posted on the Commission website and reflects the substance of his presentation.

Brainstorming on this issue explored the following responses: Divert to ADR; Colling off period before filing of charges; Fee for charges when complainant later asks for a dismissal; Show cause for charges that are not pursued. No decisions were reached as to these possible solutions.
