


Jury trials except in small claims, child protection, and non-extended jurisdiction juvenile cases

CSP Case Types:


- Exclusive civil (conciliation division: up to \$15,000).
- Exclusive domestic relations.
- Exclusive criminal.
- Exclusive juvenile.
- Exclusive traffic/other violations.

Court Variation Mirrored at State Level


Highly centralized state AOC

- Control of IT infrastructure
- Standardized statewide reporting
- Semi-centralized state
 - Some control/influence on IT
 - Some control/influence on reporting

Implications for Reporting


- Where are the records?

- What capability does court have to identify and retrieve records?




Practical Effects of Structure

- Outsourcing as a solution


General Jurisdiction Tier Caseloads




Limited Jurisdiction Tier Caseloads




Statewide Caseloads
